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Women's resistance to extractivism in southern Ecuador: Analysis of its alignment with ecofeminism. The Quimsacocha case.

ABSTRACT

This paper analyzes women's resistance to extractivism in Quimsacocha, southern Ecuador, and its alignment with the principles of ecofeminism. The objective was to identify how the practices led by women respond to a logic of territorial defense. From an ecofeminist theoretical perspective, the relationship between the extractivist model and forms of political exclusion rooted in patriarchy is examined. The methodology employed a qualitative, exploratory-descriptive approach, utilizing triangulation between a literature review case study, and in-depth interviews. Among the main findings, three pillars that configure a local Andean ecofeminism were identified: community knowledge, territorial memory, and collective action. These elements allow us to understand resistance as a daily practice of the Quimsacocha community. It also analyzes the role of international cooperation tools that have made the conflict visible, highlighting the potential for accessing international aid if resistance is articulated in conjunction with technical training processes in the communities. This study concludes that the resistance of the women of Quimsacocha constitutes a local ecofeminist expression that questions the extractive models and proposes alternatives based on the care of nature, life, and environmental justice.

La resistencia de las mujeres frente al extractivismo en el sur del Ecuador: Análisis de su alineación con el ecofeminismo. Caso Quimsacocha

RESUMEN

Este trabajo analiza la resistencia de las mujeres frente al extractivismo en Quimsacocha, al sur del Ecuador, y su alineación con los principios del ecofeminismo. El objetivo fue identificar cómo las prácticas lideradas por mujeres responden a una lógica de defensa territorial. Desde una perspectiva teórica ecofeminista, se examina la relación entre el modelo extractivismo y las formas de exclusión políticas arraigadas al patriarcado. La metodología fue cualitativa, con enfoque exploratorio- descriptivo, aplicando la triangulación entre revisión de literatura, caso de estudio y entrevistas a profundidad. Entre los hallazgos principales se identifican tres pilares que configuran un ecofeminismo andino local: conocimiento comunitario, memoria territorial y acción colectiva. Estos elementos permiten comprender la resistencia como una práctica cotidiana de la comunidad de Quimsacocha. También, se analiza el papel de las herramientas de cooperación internacional que han logrado visibilizar el conflicto, destacando el potencial para acceder a ayuda internacional si la resistencia se articula en conjunto con procesos de formación técnica en las comunidades. Se concluye que la resistencia de las mujeres de Quimsacocha constituye una expresión ecofeminista local, que cuestiona los modelos extractivos y plantea alternativas sustentadas en el cuidado de la naturaleza, vida y justicia ambiental importantes.
